### Workers United, Will Never Be Defeated!

The National Workers' All-out Rally shows power to fight against war, xenophobia, and discrimination!

#### War and xenophobia

The brutal genocide in Palestine is raging before the eyes of the whole world. Iran's nuclear facilities are also being bombed. Japan is also participating in this war. The process of world war has already begun.

Far right parties are emerging all over the imperialist countries. In the Japanese Upper House election, also the ruling party called for a "crackdown on foreigners," and xenophobic incitement escalated across the party lines. During the election campaign, they even used words alluding to the massacre of Koreans and Chinese in the aftermath of the 1923 Great Kanto Earthquake. With incessant fear mongering over "China Threat," they have been preparing a war on China.

The conditions of foreign workers in Japan are terrible. Labor rights and human rights are virtually denied. It was recently reported that a farm owner in Tochigi Prefecture who did not pay overtime wages and sexually assaulted three employees—so called "trainees"—almost daily was not even indicted and is now walking free. Revised Immigration Control and Refugee Recognition Act have led to harsh deportation policies for refugee status applicants, particularly those who have repeatedly applied and been denied.

However, such war, rightward shift and escalation of discrimination are manifestations of imperialism's decline. We can fight back.

#### International solidarity of Doro-Chiba

Doro-Chiba has been fighting against Japanese aggression, war, and discrimination since the struggle against the Japan-Korea Treaty in 1965. It was the only labor union which waged strikes against the largest union busting and mass firing in Japan—Division and Privatization of the Japan National Railways—in 1980s. Its members' unity has been maintained till today.

In 2003, when the Iraq War began, Doro-Chiba formed a partnership with the Korean Confederation of Trade Unions (KCTU) Seoul Regional Council, and since then, we have been forging our solidarity through the annual November Rally and specific struggles in both countries. We have also strengthened our solidarity with the rank and file of ILWU in the U.S. and unionists from other countries together with foreign workers and refugees residing in Japan.

#### Korean Workers Who defeated the military coup will speak at the Nov. 2 Rally

On December 3 last year, the then President Yoon Sok Yeol declared martial law, mobilized the military and attempted to arrest opposition lawmakers and union leaders. Korean workers immediately faced off against the troops, with guns pointed at them, launched general strike led by rail workers and eventually ousted Yoon.

The heroic fighters of this historic struggle, the leader of KCTU Seoul Regional Council, will be one of the main speakers of the November 2 Rally also this year.
